There is a charm about the quiet, tree-lined streets of Spiceland that suggests a college town during a long vacation. It is an old town with pride in a long history of culture, of a fine school and of art. The Spiceland Academy was founded by Friends as a school in a log cabin with the poor equipment of a pioneer town but also with the Quaker desire for all to have a chance for education. By the 1860s the crude school had grown to the Academy, recognized as among the best schools in Indiana, with as good teachers as were in most of the colleges.
